The day I came home from work and heard that there had been a shooting on Carsdale, I got the worse feeling inside, and began to pray that Bucky wasn't one of the victims. It was actually my prayer that those involved would be ok. Though my worst fear became a reality, I was able to take some comfort in the strength and dignity which MaMa displayed. You see, MaMa, up until that point, was just someone whom I saw in passing, in the neighborhood. Afterwards, I came to know her as a loving, caring, woman of quiet strength..

It's hard to forget the one whose talent I admired; laughter and bright smile I either saw or heard, (you couldn't mistake the voice!) or body I saw, jetting about on a bike throughout the neighborhood for five and a half years.
