RONALD GROSS, son of the late Doris G. Rawlings and Berlin Wells, was born on April 17, 1947 in Baltimore, Maryland. Ronald departed this life on June 25, 2008 after a brief illness. He received his education in the Baltimore City Public School System at Douglass High School. At the age of eighteen he enrolled in the military and served in the Army. During this time he served in Vietnam; and was discharged in 1967 with an honorable discharge. After leaving the army he met and married the love of his life, Elizabeth, who preceded him in death. From 1967 until 1971 Ronald drove the Yellow Cab Company and worked various jobs until he became a truck driver for U.S. Food Services formerly Continental Foods, where he retired from the position of Transportation Supervisor after thirty-seven years as a loyal and dedicated employee.
