



## Rosa Lee Colbert

January 11, 1920 - August 19, 2006

ROSA LEE COLBERT, daughter of the late James and Rosa Lee (Thomas) Morris, was born in Pensacola, Florida on January 11, 1920. Following a brief illness, she went home to God and to join her four sisters on August 19, 2006. The Morris family moved to Baltimore in the late 1920's, where Rosa Lee lived for the remainder of her life. She attended Frederick Douglass High School, at which she became noted for her singing and her vivacious spirit, and graduated in 1939. Many of the friends that she made in high school remained close to Rosa Lee for her lifetime. In June, 1942, she was joined in holy matrimony to James W. Colbert, and from this union were born James W., Jr. and Isaac M. Colbert. When the call to national duty came to James, Sr., as it did for so many young men of that era, he answered; and like so many others, suffered injuries that left his young wife to raise a family. Strong, resourceful and focused, Rosa Lee raised her two boys and ensured that they secured their college education; assertively pursued care for her husband; and provided comfort and support for her sisters until they passed on. She is survived by: her two sons, James, with whom she resided; and Isaac of Boston, Massachusetts; nephews and nieces that include Clarence Harris and Eulalia Harris-Lofton of Baltimore; Thomas Colbert, Edward Colbert, John Colbert, and Doris Taylor of Baltimore; and Ardeen Crawford, of Fayetteville, North Carolina. She will also be remembered by her lifelong friends.
