She supported him with his janitorial business which was a part-time endeavor that grew to be in great demand. When health prevented dad from running the business, mother stepped in and kept the business going along with Marvin and Reuben. She turned out to be quite the entrepreneur.

She was a great cook and we had wonderful meals as children but it became a true legacy when the grands discovered her collards and macaroni and cheese. It was a joy to watch her playing ball with the great-grands even though she was not as mobile but that didn't seem to stop the fun! She enjoyed family gatherings and that was especially clear at her 90th birthday party.
