Rosa Beauford was born June 16, 1908 in Andrews, South Carolina to Aden and Frances Alston and departed this life on March 13, 2005. She met and married Wallace Beauford, Sr. who preceded her in death. From this union seven children were born: Mary Alice, Robert, William, Edwin, Wallace - all who preceded her in death - then Lelar and Edward, her last two surviving children. Rosa Beauford was educated in the public schools of Andrews, South Carolina. Once she married, she moved to Jamestown S.C. where she lived for several years before she and her husband moved to Baltimore, Maryland. Though she spent most of her life as a homemaker raising her seven children, she later became employed at the Lord Baltimore Laundry where she worked for 16 years. It was after this time Rosa left the laundry and became involved in what would be known as her true vocation, providing daycare services for many, many families in the East Baltimore community for quite some time. Rosa was a true Christian and faithfully attended Fountain Baptist Church until her health failed her. She was a hard worker and devoted mother, neighbor, friend. For several years she took on local political causes, becoming involved with the Eastside Democratic Organization. Working for clean, safe neighborhoods, it was nothing for Rosa to knock on the doors of the neighborhood and gather enough children to sweep the entire block, front and back. She was loved by the young and the old, family, friends and co-workers. She was preceded in death by six sisters and two brothers. She leaves to cherish her memory: Ida Bean, her youngest sister; two children,
