Rosalie P. English, daughter of Robert and Mammie English, was born on September 1, 1940. She departed this life on November 25, 2003. Rosalie attended St. Francis Academy and received her B.A. from Sojourner Douglass College on July 6, 1986. She received her Masters in Education and Rehabilitation Counseling from Coppin State College on May 28, 1989. Ms. Rosalie English joined the staff at Tuerk House, Inc. on June 24, 1988. For most of that time she served as the Clinical Supervisor and touched the lives of thousands of suffering alcoholics and addicts. According to Dr. Hickey, the Director of Tuerk House, she had a miraculous healing power and transformed the most angry, lost and hopeless of patients into productive, caring and loving citizens. She possessed sound theoretical knowledge, much of which was learned, during her internship in substance abuse treatment at Johns Hopkins University. For many staff members she served as a mentor and a mother figure. She greeted anger with a smile, firm limits and wise advice. She was the spiritual guide and moral force of Tuerk House where she stood for clinical excellence, personal responsibility and decency. She leaves to mourn: her mother, Mammie English; one sister, May English; aunts, Ella Woodard, Rosalie Bell and Julia English; uncle, Brown Sawyer; three nephews, George Nealy, Gregory Nealy, and James Nelson; a host of cousins and friends.
