ROSE B. MITCHELL, daughter of the late Ola and Walter Montier, was born on June 25, 1920 in Norfolk, Virginia. On the eve of Wednesday, March 29, 2006, she heard the call of the Master and exchanged her cross for a crown. During her formative years, Rose was raised and educated in Norfolk, Virginia. Being raised in a Christian home, her religious upbringing began in the A.M.E. church in Norfolk. After relocating to Baltimore, she continued her Christian journey at the Pennsylvania Avenue A.M.E. Zion Church. Later in the 1940's the Christian journey continued at the Southern Baptist Church. During the 1940's, Rose was employed at the American Sugar Refinery. Later on, she was employed with ARA Food Services, retiring in the 1980's. "Aunt Rose" or "Nanny" (as she was affectionately called) was a friendly, kind, and giving lady, the epitome of a true Christian woman. Aunt Rose was known for her homemade macaroni and cheese (for which the recipe was never shared with anyone). Also called "Mrs. Chancellor," she was a glamorous, sharp-dressed woman whose outfit was not complete without her nails well manicured, and just the right hat to "Top" the outfit. My-My, how Aunt Rose could wear a hat. Rose also loved to travel, shop and early on loved bowling. She enjoyed spending time with her family, friends and her Southern Baptist Church family. A faithful, dedicated and active warrior of the Southern Baptist Church, Rose was a member of the Gospel Chorus (now known as the Mid Day Mass Choir), the Seasoned Saints, the Civic Committee, where she served as President for four years, and an avid attendee of the Noon Day

Prayer Hour and the Bible Discovery Hour. She remained faithful and dedicated to the end until her work on earth was done. Her son Ramonda Ysaguirre, and daughter Anita Ysaguirre Holmes preceded her in death. The legacy of Rose B. Mitchell will be cherished by granddaughters Rolonda and Ranita Holmes, great grandchildren Marvin and Crystal Wilson; one brother Matthew Montier; one sister-in-law Beverly Montier; godsons Keith Crawford and Winston Gray; a devoted and lifelong friend Susie Harris and a host of nieces, nephews, other relatives and friends.
