She enjoyed cooking and sewing until her eyesight limited these activities. She always enjoyed visiting family members in St. Mary's County and the Washington D.C. area. Her brothers, Forbes, Joseph and Aloysius Jordan preceded her in death. Rose is survived by her daughter Grace Reid and her sons Michael, Melvin and Darwin.
