Quietly and peacefully on Tuesday, April 26, 2005, God's Grace and Mercy welcomed ROSETTA AUSTIN HOPSON into His great kingdom. She was the sixth child of seven children born to the late Robert and Martha Austin on April 5, 1912, in Baltimore, Maryland. She attended Baltimore City public schools and received a Certificate of Completion for courses at Baltimore City Community College. Rosetta was married to the late William E. McCullough and from this union she had three children: the late Walter G. McCullough, William E. McCullough and the late Gloria R. Terrell. She later remarried the late Thomas E. Hopson. She also raised her eldest granddaughter, Gloria Hopson. Rosetta was outgoing, friendly and very active in the community. In her early years, she was a member of the Aisquith/Sapp Street Neighborhood Association, President of the PTA (Oliver Cromwell Elementary School) and the Eastern Star. She was a very talented woman who enjoyed preparing fabulous meals and baking cakes and pastries; singing at various local churches; reading and many other activities during her lifetime. She taught every one of her grandchildren how to play pinochle so that she had someone to play cards with her. She accepted Jesus Christ as her personal Savior and was baptized at Douglas Memorial Church. She later became a member of New Metropolitan Baptist Church in 1940 and attended Sunday Services faithfully. Throughout the sixty-five years of service to New Metropolitan she sang with various Choirs of the church as well as singing solos at various Baltimore Churches. She had an infectious laugh which you couldn't help but

laugh or smile with her. And when asked how she was doing - her response was always "I'm fit as a fiddle and ready for love." Rosetta lived a long and full life - at the time of her passing she was taking only one prescribed medication which was an iron pill. Rosetta leaves to cherish her memory: one son, a devoted daughter/granddaughter, two daughters-in-law, fourteen grandchildren, twenty-one great grandchildren, eleven great great grandchildren; and a host of other relatives and friends.
