Rudolph Valentino Watkins Sr., son of the late Rita and Samuel Watkins, one of sixteen children, was born on August 29, 1931 in Baltimore, Maryland. He departed this life on January 8, 2005 after a lengthy illness. He received his education in the Baltimore City Public School System. At the age of eighteen, Rudolph joined the United States Army and quickly pursued his passion for sports by running track and boxing. He qualified to compete in the 1952 Olympics as a member of the U.S. Boxing team that went to Finland. After leaving the Army, Rudolph enjoyed a nine year career as a professional boxer and compiled a 26-5 record. He fought first as a welterweight and light-heavyweight. His fights took him to Washington, D.C., North Carolina, Virginia, Florida and as far north as Alaska. He retired from the Social Security Administration after thirty years of service. He married the former Martha Ann James in 1953 and out of this union were four children, Cynthia, Ronald, Rudolph Jr. and Lori. Rudy or Bibsy, as he was known as, made numerous friends wherever he went. With his love for singing and dancing, you could not help but to join in. His passion for family and community is what kept him moving. He was loved by all and will be truly missed. He leaves to mourn: his loving wife of fifty-one years, Martha Ann Watkins; two sons, Ronald Watkins-Bey and Rudolph Watkins Jr.; two daughters, Cynthia Ellison and Lori Watkins; one brother, Vernon Watkins; one sister, Delores Watkins; two daughters-in-law, Donna Watkins and Taurrainee Watkins; five grandchildren, Yakimta, Kevin, Korbin, Bethany and Melody; seven great-grandchildren,
