Rudolph Woodrum was born on July 6, 1918 in Burkesville, Virginia to the late Sylvester and Annie Woodrum. Rudolph departed this life Saturday, April 13, 2013 at the age of 94 at Johns Hopkins Hospital in Baltimore, Maryland.

Rudolph joined the U.S. Navy at the age of 22 where he served for two and a half years. After leaving the U. S. navy, he moved to Baltimore where he was employed at Gilman School for Boys until he retired.

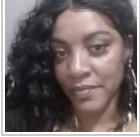
