RUTH WATTS BROWN, the daughter of the late Alvin and Mildred Watts, was born March 7, 1914 in New York City. On Tuesday, March 21st at 10:30 pm she peacefully departed this life. At a very early age she was sent to Baltimore to be raised by her grandmother, the late Mrs. Annie S. Banks. She received her education in Baltimore City public schools graduating from Douglass High School in 1931. She then enrolled in Morgan State College and in 1935 graduated with a Bachelor's Degree in Mathematics. Her first job after graduating from college was a teaching position in Northern Virginia. This was very challenging to her because she taught grades 1 thru 12 in a one-room schoolhouse. In January 1938 she married the late Damon Fulton, and from this union they had one son, Damon Watts Fulton. Having moved back to Baltimore when she married she accepted a position at the Social Security Administration, where she was employed during the war years. After the war she enrolled at the University of Pennsylvania and received a Master's Degree in Social Work in 1947. Ruth joined Union Baptist Church at an early age and remained a member until her death. She was a faithful member of the Dime Circle. In October 1950 she married William C. Brown. This union lasted 48 years until his death in 1999. Ruth and Bill loved to travel, having gone to Europe, California, and Hawaii several times. Ruth also enjoyed playing bridge and going to plays for recreation. Ruth Watts Brown always had a pleasant smile and a kind word for everyone. She will be greatly missed by those who loved her. She is survived by: her son, Damon Fulton; her

daughter-in-law, Cecilia Fulton; her grandsons, Michael, Damon, Maurice, Marvin, and Ronald; five great-grandchildren and one great-great-grandson. She is also survived by her cousins, William "Billy" Young, Lorraine Coleman and Donald Young; and sisters-in-law, Helen Pitts and Gertrude Brown; and one brother-in-law, Phillip Pitts.
