



## Sadie Elizabeth Fleeks

April 3, 1934 - January 23, 2012

SADIE ELIZABETH FLEEKES (Liz), daughter of the late Frank and Minnie Fleeks, was born on April 3, 1934 in Baltimore, Maryland. She departed this life after a sudden illness on January 23, 2012.

Liz grew up with three brothers Leroy, Mayor and James and two sisters Mary and Rosa. She was educated in the Baltimore City Public Schools. After her schooling, Liz relocated to New York. There she was employed at Chase Manhattan Bank for more than twenty years before retiring. While in New York, Liz volunteered as a balloon carrier in the Macy's Thanksgiving Day Parade for many years. After years in New York she returned to the Baltimore area and was employed by the Federal Bureau of Investigation (FBI) in Washington, DC. She remained employed with the FBI for another twenty years before retiring again in May 1996.

Liz lived a full life. She played baseball and really enjoyed watching the Bulls play. She remained active in bowling and participated in the Deer Park Bowling League. Over her lifetime she received over forty trophies for basketball and bowling. Liz was also known for shooting a mean game of pool. She was an avid spectator in all other sports.

Liz volunteered much of her time to others. She volunteered at the Randallstown Senior Center teaching basic computer skills and also

volunteered working site preparing computers for use in school systems. She received Letters of Acknowledgement from Governor O'Malley for volunteered service to the citizens of Maryland. In recent years, she was the caregiver to her mother's best friend from 2006 until 2009.

Elizabeth made numerous friends wherever she went and will be sincerely missed by everyone who knew her. She had a pleasant temperament and got along with everyone. She loved to laugh and enjoy family time.

Elizabeth leaves to mourn: one brother, James Green and sister-in-law, Annie Green of Fayetteville, NC; three nephews, Thomas and wife Devoch, Jihad and Howard; three nieces, Karen, Marsha and Vanessa and companion Maurice Coley.
