Miss Sadie Prince was the daughter of the late Rev. Jacob Prince and Mary M. Prince. She was the first child in a family of two children. She was born April 18, 1932 in Manning, South Carolina. At the age of two, her father and mother moved to Jordan, South Carolina. She received her education at the Union Cypus School. She and her sister lived on the farm with their grandmother and aunt until 1943, when their father and mother returned them to Baltimore, Maryland. Sadie went to school at 126 S. Sharp Street in South Baltimore. She worked as a day worker for thirty-nine years. She received Christ at an early age and was baptized. The family joined the House of God and Gate of Heaven Holiness Church in 1947, Elder Josh James was the pastor. Later on Sadie joined the Rev. Edward M. Reven Church on 1612 Ashland Avenue. For many years she did not belong to a church, but she would visit many churches. She leaves to mourn: her sister, Mrs. Lily Estelle W. G. Stoot of Baltimore, Maryland; niece, Mary M. Willie of Baltimore, Maryland; nephew, Joseph B. Willie of Los Angeles, California; two great-nieces, two great-nephews of Los Angeles, California; cousins, Seal, Mary Ann and Bonnie; and a host of other relatives and friends. Sadie was preceded in death by her father and mother, Rev. and Mrs. M. Prince; two nephews, Leslie H. Willie and Larry J. Willie; niece, Mrs. Kathy B. Ferguson; three brothers-in-law, Mr. Leslie Willie, Mr. Marvin Gorham and Mr. Embrick Stoot; uncle and aunts.
