SAMMIE MAE ROBINSON, the sixth of ten children was born to the late John Simon and Sallie Mae Tompkins on September 30, 1929 in Bullock County, Al. This is also where she received her education. Six of her siblings preceded her in death. She transitioned this life Friday, February 19, 2016 after a lengthy illness.

No one had to speak to them for misbehaving in church because they were well mannered due to the strict upbringing of their mother as long as they were under her jurisdiction. Her sincere desire was for all children to be saved and serve the Lord.

Even with many physical challenges, she remained a strong, self-sufficient and independent woman who knew what she wanted and spoke her mind. Even though she endured sickness and sustained numerous injuries, she yet maintained her strength without complaining, but would say, "thank God it is as well as it is." Two of her passions were her love for Sunday school and Bible class. She wanted her Sunday School book even when she was unable to attend church.

This well-groomed, self-sufficient, independent woman was so glad to be asked to work in the Sunday School Department and to serve on the Missionary Board. She performed her duties with faithfulness and joy. She just didn't take charge of her job, but she claimed personal ownership for her new position.
