SAMUEL THORNTON BERRYMAN was born on December 24, 1924 in Pamplin, Virginia to the late Thornton C. Berryman and Tellie Green Berryman. He was the fifth of nine children from this union. He entered into eternal rest on Wednesday, July 27, 2016.

He received Christ at an early age and was baptized in Sulphur Springs Baptist Church in Prospect, Virginia. He received his education in Prince Edward County and graduated from Robert R. Morton High School in 1948. Samuel Berryman proudly served his country in the United States Army during World War II. Following his honorable discharge from the Army he returned home and worked for Bethlehem Steel Cooperation in Sparrows Point, MD for forty-five years.

On January 27, 1952 he married Eva M. Dandridge from Goochland, VA who preceded him in death. Of this union four sons were reared; Wallace Dandridge, Howard Berryman (preceded him in death), Maurice Berryman and Kevin Berryman. He was a devoted member of Whitestone Baptist Church where he served on the Sr. Male Chorus, and as a member of the Deacon Board.

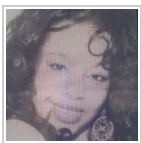
