He had two sisters and one brother. **A TIME TO GROW** Samuel, affectionately called Sam, moved to Philadelphia, PA with his father, where he grew and prospered. He attended school until the 8th grade. At 17, he went into the Civilian Conservation Corps (CCC), which was started by FDR in the New Deal legislation. **A TIME TO TAKE A FINAL JOURNEY** In 1934, Sam married Marie Hall, and they had six children: Samuel Frisby (deceased), General Henry Frisby, Estelle Minor, Sandra Allison, Elice Frisby and Jeanette Frisby; grandchildren, Robin Frisby, Mykel Allison, Larry Jones, Lori Lopez, Alexis Frisby, Maria Britten, Jason Frisby and Faith Petrushevski; also twelve great-grandchildren (one preceded him in death). Marie died in 1950. It wasn't until 1984 that he married again,, to Gertrude Jones. He was with her until her death in March, 1999. **A TIME TO TAKE A FINAL JOURNEY** On August 10, 2009, at 6:00 a.m., God whispered in Sam's ear and he traded this life for eternal life in heaven. He is now resting in the arms of the Master. **A TIME TO CHERISH SWEET MEMORIES** Sam loved life. He was charming and charismatic, he had a winning smile and a firm handshake.
