Samuel Justis Edmonds, Jr., son of the late Liana Belle Hardy-Edmonds and Samuel Justis Edmonds, Sr., was born on October 10, 1920 in Littleton, North Carolina. He departed this life on November 25, 2002 after a lengthy illness. He received his education in Littleton, North Carolina at the Terrapin School. He accepted Christ at an early age and was baptized at Lee's Chapel Baptist Church. In 1943, he came to Baltimore and joined the Zion Baptist Church under the leadership of the founder, Reverend Matthew Wilkerson.
