He also played in the City-County games while attending Douglass. He played and read music from the fourth grade to his senior year at Douglass. While there he played for Coppin State's Jazz Ensemble. Samuel had mastered the sousa phone and other brass instruments. Samuel also joined R.O.T.C. in high school where he was promoted to the highest rank of Sergeant Major of the command. Samuel joined the Job Corps and received his certificate in Culinary Arts. He did so well there that he was sent to Treasure Island, S.F., to work on getting his sous-chef license. He went into this field because he loved to eat. He held jobs at Baltimore Country Club, Moma on the Half Shell as well as other establishments. On December 31, 1997 he married his friend Reese; and out of this union a son was born, Samuel Kavon (Smiley) Epps. Samuel made many friends wherever he went and will be sincerely missed. He accepted Christ at an early age and always attended church with his grandmother. He leaves to mourn: his mother, Regina Joyce Moye; his
