



Samuel Leon Mitchell Sr.

November 5, 1924 - August 5, 2014

Samuel Leon Mitchell, Sr., son of Ida Cornish and Leon Mitchell Sr., was born on November 5, 1924 in Baltimore, Maryland and departed this life peacefully on August 5, 2014.

Samuel attended the Baltimore City Public Schools. He joined the United States Armed Forces on May 19, 1943 and participated in two invasions — the Philippine Islands (Lady Island) and Okinawa. He received his Honorable Discharge from the Army of the United States on January 7, 1946, was awarded Decoration and Citation for the Good Conduct Medal, Asiatic Pacific Theater Ribbon with two Bronze Stars and received a World War II Victory Ribbon. He worked at Goetz's Meat Company and retired from the Baltimore Gas and Electric Company.

Samuel and Catherine Tate were united in holy matrimony on November 10, 1946 and from this union came eight children — Barbara, Jacqueline, Samuel Jr., Leslie, Denise, Renae, Tanya, and Stephanie. Samuel attended St. Philip's Evangelical Lutheran Church, was confirmed on January 30, 1977 and rededicated his life to Christ as his personal Savior. He faithfully stayed in prayer, and his favorite gospel song was "Amazing Grace". His favorite Bible verse was Philippians 4:19, "But my GOD will supply all your need according to His riches in glory by Christ

Jesus".

Preceding his demise were Catherine Mitchell, two daughters Jacqueline Mitchell Davis and Barbara Mitchell Corley and three grandchildren Erica, Michael and Eric.
