Sandra Y. Johnson was the youngest of seven children born to Charles Holmes and Helen Williams-Johnson in Baltimore, Maryland. She quietly entered into eternal rest and peace on Friday, August 2, 2002 at the Stella Maris Hospice at Mercy after a lengthy illness. She was educated in The Baltimore City Public Schools and graduated from Southern High School in June 1981.
