Sarah received her education through the Baltimore County public school system. At the age of 17, she left high school to help support her family, although her love of learning never wavered. Determined to complete her studies, she proudly earned her GED on June 30, 1980. At 18, Sarah began her career as an aide at Rosewood Center. Over the course of 35 years of dedicated service, she rose to the position of Human Development Associate III supervisor before retiring. Her passion for education continued throughout her life, as she pursued classes to expand her knowledge and enrich her horizons.

Sarah later met and fell in love with Carroll Sylvester Carter of Lottsburg, Virginia, and on September 5, 1961, they were united in marriage. Their union was blessed with a daughter, Cindy Carol.

She decided to attend the Community College of Baltimore and received her Associate of Arts Degree in Psychology on June 14, 1981. Sarah enrolled in the School of the Bible in the late 1990s. When she graduated, she received

diplomas for Teachers Training III, Standard Church Ministries, Foundation Church Ministries, and Advanced Church Ministries on June 1, 1998.

Some of Mom's favorite pastimes included talking on the phone, traveling and visiting with family and friends, shopping at Macy's, and going to the movies. She found joy in reading Oprah's magazines and books by the Obamas, but her greatest devotion was to her Bible. She was especially proud when son-in-law Nathan worked on projects in her home —she loved telling everyone about his work, though she preferred to keep his talents all to herself.

Sarah was honored as one of the mothers of the church. She found joy in participating in Vacation Bible School, prayer breakfasts, and Bible study, and she also lent her voice to the choir.

Mom's favorite scripture was Psalm 27, and whenever she recited it, she inspired and uplifted the entire church.

Family was at the heart of Mom's life, and she delighted in every gathering. After Meya, her newest blessings were Melanie and Tahli (Tie lee), who adored her and lovingly called her Nana. They lifted Mom's spirits whenever she wasn't feeling her best, making her feel youthful once more.
