After 95 years on her life's journey, the Lord called his daughter Sarah A. Lofton to rest in His loving arms on Monday, February 27, 2017 in Ellicott City, Maryland. Born on October 21, 1921 in Gloucester, Virginia, Sarah was one of eight children from the union of John Lee and Pheadora Wright.
