She was a soccer mom and held a lifetime membership in the Girl Scouts of America. Sharon had a passion for flowers and plants. She was a long time member at the former Third Lutheran Church which later merged and became All Saints Lutheran Church. There she taught Sunday School and participated in the church choir. She later transferred her membership to St. Michael Lutheran Church. Sharon was dedicated to her family and her special-needs daughter. Sharon is survived by: her husband, Carlton Bruce Smith; two daughters, Brittney and Krista, and one son, David; mother, Beatrice Saunders; sister, Natalie Hope; mother-in-law, Louise Bruce; brother-in-law, Carlos Derrick Smith; sister-in-law, Paula Smith; three nephews and one niece, and a host of uncles, aunts, cousins and friends. She had a special
