



## Sharon Gail Lobo

June 29, 1952 - August 10, 2012

Sharon Gail Lobo, daughter of the late Louis and Nellie Johnson, was born on June 29, 1952 in Baltimore, Maryland. She went to be with the Lord on Friday, August 10, 2012.

As a young adult, she received the Lord as her personal Savior and was baptized at the New Hope Baptist Church under the late Reverend Lewis Campbell. After being baptized she became a young adult Sunday school teacher.

Later, Missionary Sharon Gail Lobo became a member of Refuge Way of the Cross, under the pastorate of Bishop Cannady, where she was re-baptized in Jesus' Name and filled with the Holy Ghost in 1984. She later changed her membership with Bishop Cannady to join the fellowship of the New Galilee Church of God in Christ Jesus Apostolic Faith, Inc., under the pastorate of the late Bishop Milledge Golphin in 1990.

Her tenure at New Galilee COGICJAF, Inc. has been twenty-two years of honored service (1990-2012) partly under her present pastor Dr. Eula Frazier from 1999 to her demise. Missionary Lobo has served in many different ministries of the church, until her health prevented activeness, such as Church Secretary, Adjutant to the present Pastor, Member and President of the Senior Choir, Vice-President and member of the Usher Board, Youth Sunday School

Teacher, Director of the Senior and NGC Mass Choir, Missionary Ministry and teacher of the Vacation Bible Class. She originally founded the NGC Nursing Home Outreach Ministry (Genesis on Northern Parkway) where she served diligently for nearly fifteen years.

Gail, as she was affectionately known, was educated in Baltimore City public schools. She earned an Associates of Arts degree in Early Childhood Education. Upon receiving her degree she started her own child care business and continued that business for over twenty years. Until her illness, she was a daycare teacher for Randallstown Learning Center. Gail had a willing spirit and was very creative in helping to organize, as well as decorate, the Randallstown Learning Center. She met Ronald Lobo at a young age, and they were married on October 30, 1971. Out of this union two children were born, Shamara and Ronald Jr.

She leaves to mourn: her husband, Ronald C. Lobo, Sr.; daughter, Shamara C. Lobo; son, Ronald C. Lobo, Jr.; six sisters, Louise, Doreen, Terry, Diane, Darlene and Poullette; two brothers, Calvin and Leonard (one brother preceded her in death, Louis Jr.); brother-in-law, David Flemming; sister-in-law, Donnetta Andrews; beloved aunt, Alta Helen Willoughby; and a host of nieces, nephews, other relatives and friends.

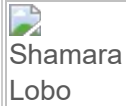
