Shirley Evans was born July 9, 1926 to Cornelia Evans and Benjamin Jackson.

Shirley graduated from Douglass High School, Class of 44. She also attended Howard University, where she completed her freshman and sophomore years.

Peabody Institute of Music selected Shirley to receive music instructions. Jim Crow laws prevented her from attending the school in person, so an instructor taught her in the family home. This training allowed her to become a gifted pianist and organist, who also loved to sing.

Saint James United Methodist Church was her church home for which she provided organist services for a number of years and then attended until she was prevented by advanced age and poor health.

The federal government and private industry provided primary employment during her working lifetime.

In her later years, Shirley, enjoyed taking trips to various casinos and the challenge of completing crossword puzzles.

She was preceded in death by her grandson, Troy Evans and companion,

Winston Johnson.
