March 25, 1935 - May 27, 2020

Death has caught us by surprise. Today, we must pause for a moment to celebrate, remember and mourn the passing of our “Dearly Departed”. Although the will to survive is greater than the will to die, there is no sorrow and no more pain. “Well done thy good and faithful servant.....” Sidney L. DeFord, Jr., son of the late Sidney L. DeFord, Sr.

and the late Rachel Pryor was born March 25, 1935 in Baltimore, Maryland. He departed this life May 27, 2020 after a short illness.

Sidney was educated in the Baltimore Public School System and received his general

education diploma from Samuel Coleridge School #122. Having the passion to serve his

country, Sidney enlisted in the United State Marines and served from November 23,

1953 to March 20, 1956. He was Honorably Discharged. Upon completing his military

service, Sidney had the desire to further his education by enrolling at Catonsville

Community College where he received an Associates of Arts Degree for general studies

in July 1973. With his education and drive to serve his country, Sidney then enlisted and

served in: the United States Army National Guard from 1977-1986 and United States Air

Force (Dover AFP, Delaware) stationed at Operation and Desert Shield/Storm” as “Sgt.

DeFord” serving as “Apprentice Air Transportation Specialist” from 1990 to 1996. Within

these branches of service, Sidney received several awards and accolades such as:

Korean Conflict Era and Peacetime Award, Lifetime Member award with outstanding

contributions to the 46th Squadron and Certificate of completion in the United States Air

Force Reserve Air Cargo Specialist Training. More notable mentions include; Air Force

Ribbons for “Superb Services”, National Defense Service Medal W/1 device and Air

Force Outstanding Unit Award.

Sidney loved working and held various positions with prestigious companies such

as Western Electric Company, Correctional Officer (various locations), and Federal

Protection Officer with the National Security Agency’s Department of Defense where

he retired his assigned badge #146 and after retirement was Blue Blazer Police Officer

with Northrop Grumman Environmental services.

His love for his country did not overshadow pursuing personal love. Sidney was joined

in Holy Matrimony with his friend, Rebecca Davis (Becky) on December 10, 1990. Thus,

their families were beautifully intertwined as one. Their bond was strong and

often

demonstrated in hosting parties, cookouts and dinners. Speaking of dinners,

LOVED to eat. He looked forward to his wife's awesome cooking and often planned

what his next day's meal was going to be. He loved listening to oldies but goodies music

knowing all the words; watching "spaghetti westerns" (i.e. "The Good, the Bad and

the Ugly", Fist full of dollars, Once upon a time in the west, etc.), war movies, baseball

and football cheering on the Orioles and Ravens, reading the Bible and assorted books.

Wearing his military jacket and hat was an honor.

He leaves to cherish his memory: Devoted Wife, Rebecca DeFord; Five daughters,

Shelia, Teara, Desiree, Cynthia and Angela; One son, Eddie; Sister, Cecile DeFord,
