SILAS NATHANIEL DINGLE, son of the late Robert and Rebecca Dingle, was born on May 5, 1918 in St. Stephen, South Carolina. Silas departed this life on Wednesday, April 10, 2013 at the Frankford Nursing Home in Baltimore, Maryland. Through God's wisdom, he was taken from his earthly labor to his eternal rest.

At an early age he accepted Christ and was baptized. He attended public schools in Berkeley County and later attended a trade school in Akron, Ohio.

Silas moved to Cincinnati, Ohio and it was at that time that he joined the United States Army. Later, he moved to Detroit, Michigan, where he lived for over thirty years. During Silas' marriage to Annie Whitehead, they were blessed with two sons, Robert and Terry, both preceded him in death.

Silas had a passion for children. In 1967, he founded the Association for the Betterment and Welfare of Children of the Future. The purpose of this organization was to rebuild the family structure in order to protect children, and to provide assistance and support.

When asked, "What is your religion?" He would answer, "I am a Christian American." He truly loved his country and was committed to being an advocate for human rights.
