Silas Clinton Jackson, son of the late Clinton and Bertha Jackson was born on March 17, 1934 in Baltimore, Maryland . Silas departed this life on April 5, 2012

Silas began his education in the Baltimore City School System and completed his education through the United States Armed Forces Institute.

Silas began his career with the armed forces in 1953 as a proud member of the United States Marine Corps. He served honorably until his discharge in 1961. During his enlistment, he received the Good Conduct Award and the National Defense Service Medal.

Silas love his country led him to continue his military career by enlisting in the United States Army.

His army career lasted until 1976 at which time he received yet another honorable discharge.

During his lengthy military career, Silas' travels took him to numerous U. S. Military bases including Camp Pendleton, Fort Dix, Fort Campbell, Camp Lejeune, and Korea, where he saw combat. Silas also spent a year in Vietnam and a good deal of time in Europe being stationed in Germany. During his Vietnam tour he received the Vietnam Service Medal Campaign Medal, two

oversees Bars, Vietnam Campaign Medal with Palm and Good Conduct Medals-4th Award.

After Silas' discharge from the army, he returned to Baltimore. His commitment to veterans led him to seek employment and subsequently retire from the VA Hospital. He was well known and liked by his co-workers who loved his sharp sense of humor and considered him a real “wise guy”.

He was married in 1953 to the late Mavis A. Malcolm, whom he met while serving in the Marine Corps. Their love of all Things military gave them many happy years together.

Silas leaves to cherish his memory two daughters, Annette N. Jackson and Marlene Malcolm, son-in-law Tracey L. Brickhouse, one grandson, Malcolm L. Brickhouse and a host of friends.
