SINCLAIR EADDY SR. beloved son of the late Leroy and Creola Eaddy, was born on May 9, 1943 in Lake City, South Carolina. On Thursday morning, January 10, 2013, Sinclair, heard his Savior say, “Welcome thou good and faithful servant.
