STACY NICOLE FRAZIER died peacefully early Saturday morning, February 25, 2006 at the age of twenty-eight, after a long battle with advance diabetes and renal failure. Stacy was educated in St. Mary's Parochial School and both Baltimore City and Baltimore County public School systems, where in 1995 she graduated from Randallstown High school with honors. She dearly loved children and family. Stacy will be remembered for her courage, strength, dependability, good humor and love for family, all of which were never more evident than during the last months of her life which she valiantly fought her over whelming health challenges and physical pain. She could light up a whole room with laughter from her jokes. She would fondly give nicknames to loved ones.
