Stanley M. Jackson December 17, 1924 - September 13, 2014 Stanley Magruder Jackson was born on December 17, 1924, in Baltimore, Maryland to the late Magruder and Laura Jackson (Comegys). He survived his only sister Margaret Sampson, who passed in 2008. Stanley was raised in the Harlem Avenue area of Baltimore. He shared many tales of his adventures as a youth in the city in the '20's and 30's. Those youthful adventures were put aside when Stanley met his first sweetheart Isabel Agnes Gracey. Shortly afterward he joined the Army. Stanley was shipped to Europe in 1943. He was assigned to the 593d Quartermaster Company, Salvage Repair. The 593d served in England, France, Belgium and Germany. He returned home in 1944. Upon coming home, Stanley and Isabel became man and wife. Their marriage lasted 34 years and produced two children, Stanley Marlon, after twelve years of marriage, and Angela Marlene, seven years later. In 1947 Stanley was hired as a bus cleaner by the Baltimore Transit Company, He worked in that capacity until 1952, when he became one of the first two black bus drivers hired by the BTC. Stanley's first bus route was the #44 line, crossing Belair-Harford-York Roads. From 1952-1954 he drove the #3, #11, #12 and #29 bus lines. In 1954, Stanley joined the Baltimore City Police Department, serving as a uniformed police officer from 1954-1955. In late 1955 he embarked on what would become a 30 year career in the U.S. Postal

Service. His wife Isabel passed in 1978. Stanley was remarried to Sylvia Wade in 1991. Greatest Joys: Colts in 1958. Orioles in 1966. Ravens in 2000. Greatest Sorrows: That his wife Isabel never met her two grandchildren Janelle Elyse Jackson and Anthony Jackson Brown. And that he didn't get to meet his first great grandson, Evan Stanley Jackson. Interests: Politics, History, Geography, Trains, Streetcars. Likes: Classical Jazz (Basie, Ellington, Mangus); Oysters; Cognac (Courvoisier); Barbara Jackson (daughter-in-law).
