



## Stephen A. Appiah

November 10, 1950 - October 3, 2003

Born on Friday, November 10, 1950, STEPHEN KOFI APPIAH was the second child of Mr. William Kwasi Fetuah Agyarko (deceased) and Mrs. Veronica Agyarko. Stephen Appiah, as a very bright young boy, attended St. Peters Catholic School in Kumasi, Ghana from 1957 to 1967. From there he furthered his education by going to Radisco Technical School, from 1967 to 1970. Stephen had big dreams, so after graduating in 1970, he went to Accra Polytechnic to pursue a four-year engineering course. In 1974, at the young age of twenty-three, Stephen, with the help of his parents, traveled to the United States (the first of his siblings to come to America). Upon arrival in Chicago he realized he was in a strange land with no family. He turned to the church where a pastor took him under his wing. He did not lose sight of the reason why he came to America and the best way, he decided was to go to school. When he expressed his interest in continuing his education, the pastor willingly agreed and sent him to school where he continued his engineering course. After graduation in 1976, he got a job and was recommended for transfer to the Dundalk Marine Company in Baltimore. He worked there for twenty-five years until his untimely death on October 3, 2003. In 1988 he met his lovely wife Betty and they married in Ghana on January 3, 1989. The couple was blessed with three children, Stephen Jr. (12 y/o), Angela (9 y/o) and Chelsea (5 y/o). He was dedicated to his church, family, friends and work. He was involved in his children's school and in many other activities. He enjoyed escorting Stephen Jr. to Boy Scout activities and coaching basketball.

He was a longtime member of the Knights of Columbus. Stephen was a very loving, kind, helpful, selfless and generous person who touched many people. He was a dedicated husband and father, a loving son, brother, friend and neighbor who will be terribly missed by all. He is survived by his grieving widow, children, his mother, four brothers and five sisters.
