Steve "Tiny" Scott was born on February 2, 1948 in Farmville, Virginia to the late Grace Brown Scott and Henry Steven Scott, Sr. He peacefully slipped into eternity surrounded by family and friends on May 24, 2008 at Hunter Holmes McGuire Veterans Hospital in Richmond, Virginia. At an early age, Steve was baptized at Race Street Baptist Church in Farmville, VA. He received his education through the Prince Edward County Public School System. He graduated from Robert R. Moton High School (Prince Edward County High School) in 1966 where he was involved in many activities and sports. Upon graduation, he volunteered for the United States Marine Corps, eager to serve his country. After his basic and special training, he was sent to war in Vietnam, where he received career-ending combat wounds. He retired from the United States Marine Corps in 1970. In 1978, after a short employment at DuPont Security Service, Steve was hired at Philip Morris, USA as a security guard; where he quickly advanced to the position of Supervisor Direct Materials C-Shift at the Stockton Street Facility. Steve was loved by all who knew and worked with him. He retired in 1998 after 20 years of service. In 1998, Steve married the former Sadie Williams of Varina, Va. Their love grew more and more each day until he was called Home to study war no more, and his pain washed away with GOD'S Kiss. Steve was preceded in death by his siblings, Henry (Mickey) Scott, Jr., Ulysses Scott, Elnora Scott Baldwin, Joyce Scott, Barbara (Doll Baby) G. Scott, and Kathy Scott-Gulley.
