He had the opportunity to meet and be mentored by excellent coaches to help young people understand the damage that bullying can cause. The youth in the football programs were very important to Steven. When considering new endeavors, he always thought about the impact his decisions would have on "his" kids. He understood that, while growing up, football gave him an outlet. Football provided Steven with an even larger family and an alternative to juvenile delinquency. He wanted to give the youth in the football programs the same alternative.

If you were Steven's friend and you introduced him to your family, they became his family. His big heart and gigantic personality were topped off by a smile that could light up a room. Steven loved music, dancing, and having a great time. He was not shy on the dance floor at all. He will be missed greatly.
