STEVEN ERVIN WEDINGTON was born to Joseph and Octavia Wedington on October 13, 1955 in Baltimore, Maryland. He departed this life on July 16, 2013 after a lengthy illness. Steven was preceded in death by his father, Joseph Wedington; brother, Jerry Gates; sister, Mrs. Elaine Foster; and his only child, Steven Lamont Wedington.

Stevie, as he was affectionately called by his family and friends, was educated in the Baltimore City Public School System. Upon graduating from Lake Clifton Senior High School he worked at the Lord Baltimore Hotel before being employed at the Maryland Shipbuilding Dry-dock Company. Over the years he was self-employed at several business entrepreneurships including (but not limited to) working as an ice cream vendor. Stevie not only took pride in his work, but truly relished the friends he made.

Stevie genuinely enjoyed the company of people of all ages and from all walks of life. He would often greet you with a warm smile which was generally followed by good conversation. His hobbies included singing, listening to music and working on automobiles.

Sometime during the 1980s, Stevie had the privilege of accompanying the late Minister John Sykes to several church services directed by the late Pastor R. Hamlet. It was in one of these services that he first accepted Jesus as his

Lord and Savior. Although he did not remain with the church, but eventually strayed from the faith, the spiritual seeds had been planted in his life. While he constantly battled many challenges throughout most of his life, whenever his sister Janis would offer to pray for him, he always accepted. Approximately one week before his death, with Janis ministering to him at his bedside in Johns Hopkins Hospital, Stevie was saved by the mercy and power of Almighty God.
