Sylvester R. Jones known as “Cutty” was born September 13, 1922 in Calvert County, Maryland. He worked for The City of Baltimore as a field engineer for thirty plus years.

He was educated in the St. Mary's County public School System. He served as a private, Rifleman 745, in Company G, 224th Engineer Regiment for the United States Army. He was Honorable Discharged in 1945. He received the World War II Victory Ribbon. He received the purple Heart Medal, Good Conduct Medal, American Theater Service Ribbon, Asiatic Pacific Theater Service Ribbon, and Philippine liberation Ribbon. He was also a member of the Dave Commanders Club in 1990.

“Cutty” enjoyed listening to jazz, known for mirroring Michael Jackson and James Brown; no one could move like him. Oh, how can we forget that infamous high kick that he would do when he just was getting started on the dance floor. He enjoyed decorating for the holidays there was never a blank wall in site.
