Terescita Gwendolyn Taylor Roane was born April 27, 1950 in Provenience, Rhode Island. She was born from the union of the late Cecil C. Taylor and Olga Clairidge Taylor. At a very early age, Teri's parents relocated to Brooklyn, NY, where she spent most of her life as a youth. Teri was brought up in and regularly attended St. Phillips Episcopal Church, also in Brooklyn. She attended New York Public Schools and after graduating from Central Community High School, enrolled in Penn State University where she majored in Public Administration. She later transferred to City College of New York where she majored in Elementary Education and minored in Black Literature and Related Studies, receiving a Bachelor of Science degree. Teri worked with various community and youth programs in Brooklyn during her teen years and through her years at City College. Some of them included the Brevort Community Center, The Kingsboro Community Center, The Children's Aide Society, The Drug Prevention Program of Brooklyn, The Federation of Addiction Agency, and The Police Athletic League, to name a few. Soon after graduating from City College, Teri moved to St. Croix, in the Virgin Islands where she accepted her first real teaching job of a third grade remedial class. After one year, she moved to Harrisburg, Pennsylvania where she accepted a multitude of educational opportunities. In addition to her educational experiences, she met many lifetime friends, including her longtime and devoted friend, Juanda Barkley. She also got married during that time and through that union, conceived her crown jewel of a son, David L. Phifer. In

1981, God lead Teri, along with her mother and her sister Barbara to Richmond to join her cousin Marjorie Taylor, as she moved back to the south. It was there that she met and became good friends with Ronald. After a lengthy friendship, the two of them decided to take their friendship to another level.
