Dr. Thaddaus L.J. Phillips, 50, of Prince Georges, Maryland (formerly of Baltimore, Maryland), went home to rest with our Lord and Savior Jesus Christ on Sunday, July 20, 2008 at 9:55 a.m. at Doctors Community Hospital in Lanham, Maryland battling a long-term illness. He was born of January 12, 1958 in Washington, D.C. to the late Gertrude Delores Pitt-Phillips and Thaddaus Phillips. Thaddaus was a 1984 graduate of Towson State University where he received his Bachelor of Science degree in Psychology/Teacher Education. In 1986 he proceeded to Coppin State University and received his Education degree in Rehab Counseling. He continued his education and received his Ph.D. in 1993 from Southern Illinois University at Carbondale. Dr. Phillips resided most of his life in Baltimore, Maryland where he became an Associate Professor in the Special Education Department at Coppin State University from 1993-2000. He was also an Assistant to the Chairman from 1998-2001, and upon his retirement Dr. Thaddaus Phillips became Department of Chairman of Special Education. Thaddaus was preceded in death by his mother Gertrude Delores Pitt-Phillips and father Thaddaus Phillips. He leaves cherished memories to: two loving and devoting sisters, Joyce A.
