



Theodore W. Jones

September 14, 1931 - August 3, 2014

Theodore Warner Jones was born September 14, 1931 at Johns Hopkins Hospital in Baltimore, Maryland, the firstborn child of Leon Levi and Zilpha-Marie Lewis Jones. Ted or Teddy, as he was called, grew up in a small family enclave in the 400 block of East 23rd Street, across the street from his maternal grandparents, Otho and Anna Bell Nash, and their youngest daughter Mary Katherine Lewis. The family lived and loved there, forging an inseparable bond until, as a pre-teen, Ted moved with his grandparents to the Marley Park area of Glen Burnie. This would remain his homestead, despite ventures overseas and throughout the states, until his death on Sunday, August 3, 2014. Ted lived a typical American teenager's life working for his grandfather's landscaping business, attending and graduating from Frederick Douglass High School, and then moving on to Morgan State College where he met and married Norma Clement. Shortly after college, Ted joined the U.S. Army and served a two-year enlistment in Germany and earned a Purple Heart during the Korean War. Upon his return home, he began a long, progressive career in law enforcement, first as a Harbor Tunnel police officer and then as a correctional officer at the Baltimore City Jail. After a stint with the federal marshal service, Ted hit the ground running with a newly established statewide Public Defender's Office. He would spend 35 years in public service in law enforcement. The Jones family started with three sons, Darryl, Wayne and Brian. Now family gatherings include wives Theresa (Darryl) and Michele (Wayne); stepson, Andrew (Katrina); grandchildren,

Brock, Mason, Brianna, Shane, Autumn, Arynn, Evan, Chris, Jordan; and family friend, Molli (Brian). But today, when the Jones Family sits in its reunion there will be an empty chair amongst us, that of our dearly departed patriarch, Theodore Warner Jones. Theodore is also survived by his wife Beverly Washington Jones, sister Carol Ann Jones, Aunt Mary Lewis Burke, and a host of devoted nieces, nephews, cousins and friends.
