THEODORE STANSBURY was born on May 15, 1932 in Baltimore, Maryland to the late James I. Stansbury and Annabell Gray. He was affectionately known by family and friends as “Stan”. He attended Baltimore City Public Schools. He was inducted into the United States Army on February 24, 1953. He served as a Military Police Officer during the Korean War and remained there until his discharge on February 23, 1955. He worked for the General Services Administration until he retired.

Theodore married at a young age and from that union, six children were born: Theodore Reginald Stansbury (Jackie), Eric Stansbury (George Ann), Keith Stansbury (Pamela), Annette Grooms (Gamal), Cherylynn Peters (Chris), and Mark Stansbury.
