He and his baby brother Arthur (Butsie), remained joined at the hip until the very end. His sister Mary (Tippy) was very protected by both of them. He enjoyed spending time with his grandchildren and cooking up his own concoctions that were many times very delicious.

He always instilled in his children, grandchildren, nieces, nephews, siblings and others the importance of striving to do better. He was a teacher and philosopher whose audience was often times his family and the community. He was a force to be reckoned with, he didn't pull any punches, shot straight from the hip, but always had good intentions.

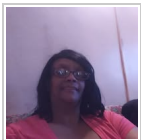
