THERESA ANNETTE NESBITT, the first-born child of the late Milton and LeVonne Barnes, began her journey on July 5, 1941 in Baltimore, Maryland. She quietly departed on October 1, 2020 after a lengthy illness.

Theresa accepted Jesus Christ as her personal Savior at an early age. She was baptized at White Stone Baptist Church in Baltimore, Maryland, under the leadership of the late Reverend William H. Thompson. She continued in her faith throughout the years until she could no longer participate in services.

Theresa was educated in the Baltimore City Public School System, graduating from Frederick Douglas High School. She continued her education at the University of Maryland School of Nursing where she obtained her degree as a licensed practical nurse.

In 1961, Theresa married the late Lt. Colonel Earl William Nesbitt, Sr. From this union, three children were born; Earl William Nesbitt, Jr., "Chucky", LeVonne Annette Nesbitt, and Lisa Denise Nesbitt.

While living in various states as a military spouse and mother, Theresa always found an opportunity to work in her beloved profession as a nurse. When she returned to Baltimore, Maryland in 1977, she began working at Levindale Hebrew Geriatric Center, where she retired in 2008 after 31 years of service.

As a medical professional, she was meticulous and took great pride in her work. She often mentored new nurses, encouraging them to continue their education. In the latter years of her career, it was not uncommon for her to volunteer to work extra shifts during the holidays for single mothers. She wanted to give them an opportunity to spend time at home with their children. Some of these same women cared for her when she became ill.

Theresa was a quick-witted, fast talker who had a great sense of humor and an infectious laugh. She enjoyed traveling to visit family and fellowshiping while dining on good food or fresh crabs. She was an avid reader who also enjoyed attending live theater and the movies. Her greatest gift was her giving spirit. She cared deeply for her family and friends, and didn't hesitate to give of her time and resources to those in need. Her passion for the well-being of women and children was evident in her work as a volunteer at the House of Ruth in Baltimore, Maryland. She was valued by many as an excellent listener, a wise advisor, and a loyal friend. Her loving spirit will live on in the hearts of all who knew her.

Theresa was preceded in death by her son, Earl W. Nesbitt, Jr. "Chucky". She leaves to cherish her memory: two daughters, LeVonne A. Nesbitt and Lisa D.
