THOMAS JEROME BROWN was born October 12, 1939 in Charles City County, Virginia. He was the youngest of four children born to the late Leslie Brown and Sarah Jones Brown. At the age of nine, he gave his life to Christ, was baptized and joined Gilfield Baptist Church located in Charles City. As a member of Gilfield Baptist Church he was very active and served on the Junior Missionary Board, Usher Board, and sang in the choir. He continued to maintain a relationship with Gilfield where he joyfully visited on special occasions. Jerome was educated in the Charles City County Public School System. He graduated from Ruthville High School in 1959. After graduating from high school he moved to Richmond, Virginia and was employed by the Great Atlantic and Pacific Tea Company (A&P) grocery store chain. He retired in the late 1980's after 30 years of service. Until his death he was employed as a part-time Sales Advisor with Club Demonstration Services located in Costco. In 1980, Jerome joined Rising Mount Zion Baptist Church where he became a faithful member, served on the Pastor's Aid Committee and sang with the Echos of Zion. He became a deacon in 1994, and truly demonstrated his sincerity about his spiritual beliefs. As a deacon, he served as secretary and treasurer of that ministry, and as chairman until his death. He leaves to cherish his memories: the mother of his children, Ervine Trower Brown; his devoted children, Kirk Brown (deceased), Wanda Brown and Yhonna Minor (Timothy); four grandchildren, Regan Mason, and India, Yhonna, and Timothy Minor; sisters, Catherine Jackson (deceased) and devoted Doris Lightfoot;

brother, Carlton Brown (Margaret); uncle, Archer Jones (Etta); stepmother, Loretta Brown; stepsisters, Robin Brown (deceased) and Rose McMickens; stepbrothers, Leslie and Earl Brown; devoted niece, Danita Barnes; a host of nieces, nephews, cousins, and special friend, Patricia Baldwin; and other relatives and friends.
