



Thomas Rudolph Curry

February 16, 1929 - February 3, 2005

Thomas Rudolph Curry departed this life on February 3, 2005 at the age of seventy-five. He was born on February 16, 1929 in Annapolis, Maryland the youngest child of Edward and Mamie Green Curry. Thomas had four brothers and five sisters all of whom have preceded him in death. Although his parents were Protestant, he was sent to parochial school. This early introduction to the Catholic church led to his lifelong practice of the Catholic faith. Thomas lost his mother when he was a young adolescent. The gracious support of a local grocer who gave him a job and the minister of a neighborhood church took him into his home, and he was able to stay in school. He went to Bates High School where he became a staunch successful member of the football team and the boxing club. After graduation, Thomas went to Princess Anne Community College. His education there was interrupted when he was drafted into the United States Army during the Korean Conflict in 1953. He saw heavy combat, was severely injured and honorably discharged in 1956. Following his military service, he moved to Baltimore where he met and married Anna Anthony in 1962. From this union, Antonia, his devoted only daughter was born. For more than forty years Thomas was a federal employee. He retired from the Social Security Administration in 1995. Outgoing and friendly, Thomas was a member of civic and fraternal organizations. He was especially active in the American Legion Post 141 of Annapolis and the Knights of Columbus. A caring and attentive family man, he remained close to his nieces who last year on his 75th birthday gave him a wonderful birthday party.

Thomas was especially close to his two granddaughters Crystal and Diamond. He was proud of their school achievement and attended many of their school activities. In addition to Antonia, Crystal, Diamond, and Anna, he is survived by: nieces, Mary, Josephine, Mamie, Barbara, Edith, Katherine, and Shirley; his sister-in-law, Clara; and a host of extended family and friends.
