Sunset: Wednesday, March 22, 2023 – Highland Springs, Virginia

A Time to be Born.

My life began on Saturday, December 10, 1966, at 3:07 p.m., in Florence, South Carolina, as Timothy Sylvester Thomas, the first-born child to Vivian Ann Thomas and biological father Willie Lee “Stuckey” Jackson, Jr., at McLeod Hospital. Later, moving to Richmond, Virginia in 1968, my mom met and married Ralph D. Minor on March 4, 1973, who later adopted me. Thus, my name was changed to Timothy Sylvester Thomas Minor. Most of my family and friends know me as Tim, Timmy, and Tim-Tim. And it’s befitting that I give a loving shout out to my deceased grandmother, Mrs. Queenie B. Thomas, who generously gave me a formative upbringing during my young life in Florence.

A Time to Live.

My early education began at Trinity Baptist Church Day Care, Darlington Street, Florence, South Carolina (where I had a penchant of leaving to go back home to my grandmother, which was several blocks down the street). My

dear Aunt Mary Lillie Pipkins (my mother's youngest sister—deceased) was faithful enough in catching me walking at three years old. Coming to Richmond at the age of five, I attended Carver Elementary School and J. B. Fisher Elementary School (when the integration of busing began), Fair Oaks Elementary School, Fairfield Middle School, and Highland Springs High School, graduating in 1985; and Moseley-Flint Schools - Principals of Real Estate.

My sports activities included little league football (Hartshorn Dragons) and (Highland Springs Bulldogs), and Highland Springs recreational baseball—winning several team trophies (football and baseball) and Most Valuable Player (HS Bulldogs); Fairfield Middle School, tennis; and Highland Springs High School, 4-year varsity football team. I also played with the Virginia Ravens (semi-pro football team), Richmond, Virginia. Didn't make the NFL, but I love me some Dallas Cowboys.
