Tisha's hobbies included: dancing, swimming, and enjoying many social gatherings with family and friends.

Tisha believed in family and togetherness. Her parents gave her a solid foundation which enabled her to develop strong morals and values becoming the beautiful person that she was. Her sisters Charlotte Plaskett and Natasha Sonny-Williams were her role models and shared very special life-long bond. Her youngest sibling and only brother Lester Sonny truly admired and looked up to Tisha. Their relationship could be described as 'birds of a feather flocked together?'.
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Tisha found undying love when she met Darren 'Nyah' Kerr whom she knew was her soul mate. From their relationship, in 2004, she embraced motherhood by the blessing of her

daughter, T'Nyah Kerr. One year later, her second blessing and bundle of joy Adonai
