Troy Melton, son of the late Lisch and Gertrude Melton, was born August 8, 1952, in Baltimore, MD. He departed this life on September 11, 2004 after a lengthy illness. He received his education at Merganthal High School in Baltimore. After being employed at several jobs, he joined the United States Navy in 1976. He was stationed in California where he lived until he retired in 2001. During his career in the Navy he held the position of Aviation Structural Mechanic (hydraulics) first class and drug and alcohol counselor. He was a decorated seaman who was awarded many certificates and medals. After he retired from the Navy, September 1, 2001, he pursued his passion by attending culinary school to become a chef. Due to his illness, he was forced to return to Baltimore to be placed on the list for a lung transplant and fell short of becoming a culinary chef by a few months. His other passions were African-American history and his family. Toward the end of June 2004, Troy collapsed and was in the hospital until he succumbed to his illness on September 11, 2004. Troy loved life, enjoyed traveling and participating in a good debate. He had a smile for everyone and had a spirit of encouragement. He gave his life to Christ years earlier and was baptized at Bibleway Baptist Church in early 2004. He leaves to mourn: one brother, Robert Melton; two sisters, Rosalee Higgs and Edna Raymond; sister-in-law, Lillie Melton; brother-in-law, Samuel Higgs; six nephews, Kenny Melton, Michael Melton, Dontae Melton, Lamar Higgs, Marvin Melton, and Shawn Raymond; one niece Dawn Mechelle Ford; a long time friend, Joyce Rouser; and a host of great

nephews, nieces, cousins, relatives and friends.
