Tully Curlee Sullivan was born on July 25, 1933 in Fountain Inn, Laurens County, South Carolina to Ceona Blanche Pinson and Tully Azariah Sullivan. He departed this life on April 8, 2019 as a result of an injury.

Tully graduated from Frederick Douglass high school in Baltimore as class valedictorian. Tully began his 37 year career with General Motors shortly after graduating from high school.

Tully served in the United States Army during the Korean War as a mechanic. Shortly after the war ended, Tully was honorably discharged from the Army and returned to Baltimore to continue his career with General Motors.

Tully married Charlotte H. Cooper on April 6, 1957. From this union there were four children, Tully Keith, Lisa Karen, Peter Eric and Martin Lee. With Charlotte, he planned special activities for his children. They took them on day trips and longer trips--always with an educational aspect to them.

Tully was very involved in all forms of church work. He started his faith walk at Union Baptist church, Baltimore before converting to Catholicism. At his parish church, Immaculate Conception, Druid Hill avenue, he served in many capacities including driving the van, going on Eucharistic visits to shut-ins with his wife, and was known as the "go to guy". Tully also served as a member of

Saint Vincent DePaul society.

Tully was an avid bowler, pinochle player, baseball coach, and fisherman. He was the best electric slide dancer on the east coast and an overall Mr. Fix it.
