Ulysses received his formal education in the St. Louis public school system. After moving to Baltimore, he received an Associate of Arts degree at the Community College of Baltimore. He joined the U.S. Army at seventeen years of age. He spent twenty years of his life serving his country in the Korean War, as well as statewide. During his time of military service, Ulysses met and married Phyllis G. Stanton, and from this union was born two children, Stephen and Patricia. The highlights of his life were his four grandchildren. He was quite proud of all of them and of their academic achievements. In his spare time, Ulysses was an avid photographer. If you saw him you saw his camera. No one was safe from it! He even managed to conquer videography. He also had a massive collection of videotapes. Ulysses also loved to bowl. At one point he was a member of three bowling leagues and had become a very accomplished bowler. One other thing about Ulysses was that he was jack-of-all-trades, and quite the master. He could fix or build anything. Ulysses A. 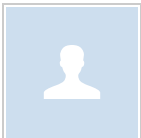
